The Christmas Season is full of traditions, such as: Christmas trees, lights, decorations, stockings, cookies, carols, Santa, presents, special movies and shows, stories, pageants, concerts, and even the 'elf on the shelf.' That's quite a few traditions, and there are plenty more. There is even a market for 'ugly Christmas sweaters!'

What does the Church teach us about traditions? St. Paul teaches us to 'stand fast and hold the traditions which you were taught, whether by word or our epistle.' (2 Thes. 2:15) Of course, St. Paul isn't speaking of man-made or family traditions but rather Holy Tradition, which is the apostolic teaching (oral or written) in the Church that conveyed the Gospel of

Christ. For us believers, we are called to sanctification and to live a life of holiness within the Church through the holy sacraments. The two sacraments that we are called to 'hold and stand fast in' throughout our lives are Confession and Holy Communion. Thus, we receive divine sanctification, healing and ultimately are led by God's grace to our salvation in Christ.

Whenever we celebrate the holy feasts of the church, we do so by not offering a concert or play but by celebrating the Divine services of the church (Vespers, Matins and Divine Liturgy). This is Holy Tradition. If we prepare ourselves to receive Holy Communion, we then prepare ourselves to receive Christ. We Christians who were baptized and received a new birth through water and the spirit are born into the Kingdom of Heaven and we receive the Heavenly Food every time we receive of Christ in Holy Communion. Thus, our heavenly 'birthrights' are fulfilled each time and we are filled with the Holy Spirit. If we choose to live a life without Christ and the Holy Tradition of the Church, we establish our own traditions that we create, engineer and execute according to our own whims and desires. That is utter destruction, a recipe for disaster, and our heavenly 'birthrights' are handed over to the devil.

We must stand fast and hold onto the Holy Tradition of the Church so that we can 'turn the page' and come back to the recipe of our salvation! Let us commend our lives to Christ and Christ alone! Let us remember the true traditions that actually matter! Let us celebrate His birth by uniting ourselves to Him and to His Church!

I pray that all of our beloved parishioners and friends have a blessed and joyous celebration of the Nativity of our Lord. May the Lord bestow His blessings upon each and every one of you!
