## <u>Annual Parish Meeting Reports - January 2024</u> <u>Ladies Society</u>

The Ladies Society members had a very active year in 2023 with a mix of traditional and new events. In February, we provided refreshments for the Priest's meeting with Metropolitan ANTONIOS before Vespers. We participated in March Ladies Month by reading the Epistle in English and Arabic. Also in March, we served a Lenten lunch after Divine Liturgy to raise funds for the 2023 Antiochian Women's Project – Disaster Relief (people affected by the earthquake in Turkey & Syria). We also prepared the Presanctified meal after services at our church.

The Ladies Lenten Corner was published each week in the bulletin during Lent with a Devotional and Lenten snack and recipe ideas. We plan to continue with this column once Lent starts this March. If anyone has a

In May, we attended and hosted the lunch for the retreat with Mother Gabriella. Also, that weekend, we provided appetizers and dessert for St. George Day.

December 17<sup>th</sup> the kids performed this year's Christmas Pageant. The show was directed and put together by Faiz Simone and some of the teen soyo group – with lots of help from the whole Simone Shaheen family, thank you!

Our classes had a 2 week break for Christmas eve and New Years eve and then resumed classes January 7, 2024. We are kicking off 2024 working on Creative Arts projects with the theme, "All things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His Purposes" Romans 8:28. Thank you to Liz Macris and Jazla Hilaneh for overseeing this process for us with getting the info out, packet print-outs, registration deadlines, etc. Those will be due March 17. We will continue to dedicate class time for creative arts and complete our lessons on the book of Romans to finish out the 2024 Sunday School year.

## Annual Parish Meeting Reports - January 2024 ST. GEORGE CHARITABLE OUTREACH MINISTRY



Most of this year was devoted to the new MEAL MINISTRY and reaching out to our own parishioners, however in the Fall we focused on projects that reached out into the community:

## SOCKTOBER

Men's, Women's and Children's new and like-new socks were collected the month of October and donated to the Refuge of Hope. We collected 460 pairs of socks!

## VETERAN'S DAY PROJECT

Ladies of St George took on a project to donate monetarily to the SAM Center in Massillon which addresses the needs of Veterans on all levels, year-round. Pam Huggett chaired a Brunch after church on October 29<sup>th</sup> — although the attendance was disappointing, the Ladies added to the \$260 profit to make it \$500 which Parish Council matched. We were able to donate \$1000 to this cause.

## COAT DRIVE

Coats of all sizes and types were collected in the Social Hall and donated to Refuge. This is an ongoing need and coats/clothing may be left in the Hall and will be delivered weekly.

## THANKSGIVING COLLECTION

Monies from the Thanksgiving Collection from parishioners, along with \$500 from the Ladies was again matched by Parish Council. We were able to purchase \$2000 in Marc's gift cards, along with \$400 in Aldi's gift cards which were donated in memory of David Tomey. These cards were distributed on Dec 4<sup>th</sup> to Crenshaw, Gibbs and Schreiber Schools to be used at their discretion for families who have a need.

### **GIVING TREE**

Three families were adopted from the Community Christmas Giving Tree Project and provided gifts for the holiday. One never knows the impact of generosity and whose heart, either in those who give or in those who receive, will be touched. May we continue to reach out to each other and to those we will never know with gratitude for God's Blessings and His Love.

Last January, Father Michael called me and asked me to head a food ministry, knowing that the Middle Eastern Dinner had come to an end and I can cook and I like to organize. Since I consider a privilege to feed people, it was an honor to accept.

Another bonus is that we have a wonderful core of volunteers who are committed to St. George and helping others. This ministry would not exist if it were not for their caring hearts and dedication. I would publicly acknowledge all of them. Thank you for showing up, rearranging your schedules, cooking, cleaning up and delivery. Thank you for all your input and support!

Along with those who are so willing to donate their services, I would also like to thank those of who have donated money to the ministry, since this is all pulled off by donations. Along with more modest ones, we are grateful for every penny. The donations are strictly used for food and packing supplies, nothing else.

The decision on who receives a meal is simple. If you are a nonagenarian, (a person who is from 90 to 99 years old), if you are ill, if you are bereaved, if you are a shut in, or if you simply need a pick-me-up, we put you on the list. Some people have declined, and that is fine. It is not a requirement to be a member of St. George to be on the list. We have a few people who are not members, and they get a monthly delivery. We average about 25 meals per month that we deliver. Also, if you know of someone to add to our list, please contact Father Michael, Sherry Albaugh or me, no questions asked.

After we were up and running, we added a new facet. We make an additional ten meal package which we send to Aultman Woodlawn Palliative Care. These are for the families and friends of people who are in a hospice setting.

Just last month, we switched up things a bit. Our volunteer team generously donated items. We met in the Social Hall, compiled 25 bags consisting of items such as puzzle books, socks, toiletries, popcorn, crackers, and of course icon bookmarks. They were delivered to Bethany and Altercare of Louisville for those residents who do not have visitors. The generosity of those who donated is very touching and humbling.


We look forward to 2024 to continue this small, but mighty ministry. Thank you, Father Michael, Sherry Albaugh, the volunteers and all of you for your support!
