Basketball Tournament Personal Reflection by Elia Corbin (November 8th-10th, 2024)

"Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity!" - Psalm 133:1

The Midwest Basketball Tournament is a wonderful event that our church is blessed to host every year. As teens in our widespread diocese, we are often faced with a lack of in-person communication, and we are forced to rely on electronic means to talk with our friends which is simply not the same as being there with them. This is an opportunity where the basketball tournament can come in and bridge this gap, uniting friends who live far away and having fun over basketball games.

In my opinion, the Basketball Tournament has a three-fold purpose. The first purpose comes in the form of the actual sport of Basketball. As the name suggests, is an outlet to play Basketball together, compete with other churches and teams, and an opportunity to physically train up our skills in practices we host in the weeks leading into it. Many of us do not play basketball for our schools, but we recreationally find time to play and have fun together at each practice to prepare for the tournament. Finally, when the tournament comes, it is a competition that awards, but at its core, it's just for fun! It's important to remember that this is just church basketball, not some big competition that holds immense value. In the end, it doesn't matter who wins or loses, it's about having a good time with each other.

This takes me to what I believe is the second purpose of the Basketball Tournament, fellowship and meeting new people. It is not rare to have people come to the tournament solely to see their friends, meet new people, and engage in fellowship with our community during the tournament. Most of these reunions are from friendships formed at a summer camp like the Antiochian Village which is very popular among the teens. I met most of my friends who came to the tournament at camp, otherwise, I wouldn't be nearly as close with them or even know who they were. But reunions aren't the only thing going on, also meeting new people is a big purpose of the tournament. As nice as it is to see your friends, you also want to make new ones and make ties with other Orthodox Youth across the diocese which I saw a lot of this year.

The third and final purpose of the basketball tournament is to serve as a spiritual retreat. I credit this way of thinking to my friends in Flint, Michigan as it was not something that immediately popped out to me as a characteristic of the tournament. The basketball tournament functions as a short weekend getaway, not only to play basketball or meet people but to work together on a spiritual level. Prayer is an essential part of the tournament weekend, we pray the evening prayers before we go our separate ways, we pray before each game, and we pray together in the church for Vespers and the Divine Liturgy. Incorporating our faith into this weekend is essential, we need to remember who we are and why we are here. Teen SOYO is an Orthodox Youth Organization that seeks to integrate each young person fully into the total life of the church. In such a short, packed weekend, we can easily lose focus of this. I was very glad to see advisors talk to their groups about this, namely about keeping God in focus and making this a spiritually beneficial retreat.

If I had to define the 26th Annual Basketball Tournament in one word, I would call it a success. My reasoning behind this is multi-faceted, but it followed all the ideal purposes of a good tournament. The weekend started on Friday night when all the teens from around the Midwest started arriving at the hotel for the reception and registration period. Although some churches came significantly later, a good majority of the teens arrived and immediately started talking and bonding with the other teens. The next event of the night was when Tim Wires delivered an excellent presentation about the Armor of God and his life experience concerning it. This really kicked off the weekend to a great start and got the ball rolling for spiritual reflection during the tournament. Afterwards, more or less, is just the rest of Friday night left for socialization and engagement with teens from other churches. Many of us stayed late to welcome some of the churches who came from farther distances like St. Mary's in Palos Heights and St. Michael's in Louisville.



Saturday is by far the largest and most important day of the tournament, it is not only when the actual games are played, but also includes the evening Vespers service, Awards Presentation, Banquet, and Hafli in the evening. This year, we were able to utilize a new facility which we haven't used in the past. Instead of having games in different locations we were able to consolidate everything under a single roof at Swish 365. We had a bright and early start at 8 AM for the first game and continued energetic and exciting matches all the way until the final game started at 3:20 PM. After the games had finished everyone returned to their hotels and started preparing themselves for the evening which would have everyone attending Vespers which would immediately be followed by the banquet and awards presentation. The Vespers service really brings up the spiritual nature of the weekend, it is important to be continually prayerful and to end the evening giving thanks to God. Afterwards, Fr. Michael gave a short speech addressing the teens and dismissing them with the blessing cross to the banquet for a wonderful dinner. A wonderful group of volunteers prepared an amazing gourmet meal which received positive reviews from all the participants. Once everyone was served, Fr. Michael again addressed everyone and handed off the microphone to the current Teen SOYO President, Elia Corbin who gave a welcome speech and thanked all the participants and churches for attending, as well as the volunteers who made the weekend possible. When the food was finished, the awards were presented to the first, second, and third place winners among all three divisions with group photos being taken at each one. Finally, the banquet had concluded and the Hafli begun for a fun night of dancing and celebrating the weekend.

At last, Sunday had come along which was the last day of the basketball tournament weekend. It is an amazing experience being in the presence of a church full of young people who willingly came from both near and far to participate in this event. Fr. Michael encouraged everyone to feel as though they were at home, including inviting the boys to serve in the altar, and anyone to sing along with the choir during the Divine Liturgy. After the liturgy, we were dismissed to a farewell luncheon in which we had another great meal and said our goodbyes to everyone until next time! Glory to God for bringing us all together in fellowship this weekend, and a special thank you to all the volunteers and donors who made this weekend possible.

Dr. Najeeb Haddad Named Director of Liturgical Translations Department

"One of the main priorities of the Liturgical Translations Department is the further development, future launch, and continued maintenance of the DOXA software platform," declared new Liturgical Translations Department Director, Dr. Najeeb Haddad. "It is an invaluable tool for local liturgical translators."



Dr. Haddad, who holds a Ph.D. in New Testament and Early Christianity from Loyola University Chicago, began his tenure at the Orthodox Christian Mission Center this past week. He is the author of several academic books as well numerous articles, and has a background in biblical languages (Classical/Koine Greek, Hebrew, and Coptic) and philological and exegetical methods. He has also served as Assistant Professor of Religious Studies at Notre Dame of Maryland University, where he taught courses in Biblical studies, early Christianity, and Orthodox mystagogy.

"I'm deeply inspired by our mission and commitment to making the richness of the Orthodox faith accessible to communities around the world in their own native languages and building upon the work of my predecessor Dr. Michael Colburn, who journeyed from being a Wycliffe Bible translator to a Mission Specialist at the Mission Center, champion of this cause the past fourteen

years, and the founder and developer of the DOXA software. We are well-positioned to become a leading resource in the field of liturgical translation-not only within the U.S. but, most importantly, internationally."


We look forward to your participation at this upcoming meeting and appreciate your continued faithful dedication to your church.
