Dear spiritual brethren and children,

During Great Lent, each of us invokes the Lord of Salvation, the Master of Life and Death, and cries to Him from the depths of our soul: Lord, have mercy!

During Great and Holy Lent, the soul goes to the Bridegroom, to the heavenly Bridegroom, with whom it rises from the dead and seeks the dawn of resurrection. In Great Lent, the soul accompanies its Bridegroom, Christ our God. It accompanies Him and calls upon Him as it treads the path of repentance, a path crowned with suffering but adorned with the resurrection from an empty tomb.

From the Sundays of preparation, this soul draws inspiration for its journey of repentance. On the threshold of Great Lent, it invokes Christ, worships, and contemplates with Him, starting tomorrow on Meat Fare Sunday, the fate of those who did neither show mercy nor have compassion on their neighbor. It also contemplates the share of those who showed mercy. It converses with the Bridegroom and contemplates with Him on the Sunday of Forgiveness, the paradise lost by humanity with Adam, the first created.

With the start of Lent, the soul contemplates the beauty and splendor of the Orthodoxy on the Sunday of the veneration of icons, that transports us from today's world to eternity whose light we perceive on the faces of the saints. On the second Sunday, this soul proceeds to learning about honoring the saints, who have received their grace and holiness from the Holy One. On the third Sunday, in the middle of the journey, this soul returns to contemplate the Wood of the Cross and the One Who was hanged on it out of love for humankind that has forsaken Him, but which He never forsook. With John Climacus, the soul dwells on the path of virtues and walks along to meet the experience of Mary of Egypt. There, it learns with Mary that repentance is the foundation, first and last of all, in the journey of Great Lent, that is, the journey of repentance.

All this culminates in the soul's encounter with her Christ Bridegroom; she receives Him as He enters the heavenly Jerusalem through her and together with her. It spreads for Him the branches of the soul and enters with Him into His salvific sufferings. It invokes Him in His funeral as Christ the Life Who tramples death, and after that, as the Light and the Lord Who is Risen from the dead, bestowing life to those in the tomb.

This is the journey of the Church and this is her guide for the soul of each one of us to walk in the company of this heavenly Bridegroom. Great Lent is a journey of repentance and a journey of mercy that translates into actions.

We raise our prayers in these blessed days and ask the Lord of Mercy and the God of compassion to send His compassion to the whole world and bless everyone, perpetuating in the hearts His good hope and implanting in the souls the balm of His divine consolation. May He embed the human being with some of His forbearance and radiance. May He calm with the power of His silence the darkness of this world that is raging with wars, kidnapping, boiling anger, and takfirism. We ask Him to embrace our departed souls into His holy bosom, to bestow upon them the light of His mercy, and to reassure souls and households.

For He is the Blessed and Glorified One forever and ever, Amen.

## Creamy Vegetable Noodle Soup

Ingredients

- 2 Tbsp. Olive Oil
- 1 yellow onion, diced
- 3 carrots, peeled and diced
- 2 ribs celery, diced
- 1 red bell pepper, seeded and diced
- 1 Tbsp. dried parsley 1 Tsp. dried basil 1 Tsp. dried thyme ½ Tsp. dried dill 1 Tsp. salt, or to taste
- 4 Tbsp. all purpose flour. For gluten free option, use brown rice flour. 2 cups unsweetened and unflavored non-dairy milk, divided. 4 cups low-sodium vegetable broth 2 Tbsp. nutritional yeast, optional 1 cup dry ditalini pasta or similar small pasta (gluten-free or whole wheat, if desired).

#### **Directions**

Heat the olive oil in a soup pot over medium heat. Add the onion and saute for 5 to 6 minutes until soft and translucent. Add the carrots, celery, and bell pepper and saute 4 to 5 minutes until starting to soften.

Add the parsley, basil, thyme, dill, salt, and flour and stir to combine, scraping up any bits of flour on the bottom of the pot. Slowly pour in ½ cup of milk while whisking continuously, again scraping up any bits of flour on the bottom. Whisk until the flour is completely incorporated.

Add the remainder of the milk, vegetable broth, and nutritional yeast, if using. Whisk to combine. Increase the heat to high and bring to a boil. Once boiling, add the pasta, and then reduce the heat to medium-low and simmer for 10 to 15 minutes until the pasta is cooked through, stirring often to prevent the pasta from sticking.

Taste and adjust the seasoning, if necessary.

#### **The Great Fast**

March 3: First day of the 40 day Fast (we refrain from meat and dairy products) March 25:
Annunciation to the Theotokos and April 13: Palm Sunday—Fish is allowed
Holy week (April 14 - April 19) is kept as a strict fast week

(True fasting involves not only fasting from certain foods but also fasting from our sins! We should discipline ourselves in this period to come to the realization that we no longer need to rely on anything but God and His Word. Fasting is always used as a spiritual discipline alongside with prayer. The young, those who are pregnant or nursing, and the elderly who are unable to fast are not expected to follow all of the guidelines.)

The Archbishop Michael Shaheen Educational and Charitable Fund is once again offering scholarships to 2025 high school graduates who are furthering their education through college, university or technical training. ## Explaining the Lenten Services......

#### صلاة النوم الكبرى Great Compline

(Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays during the Great Fast)

Great Compline is an evening service that is normally held after the dinner meal and consists of readings from the psalms and a collection of special hymns that reflect thanksgiving and repentance, as well as prayers before we sleep. Some of these hymns are well known by the puring this service, the Lenten prayer of St. Ephraim the Syrian معنا هو الله . `and 'God is with us بالقوات `During this service, the Lenten prayer of St. Ephraim the Syrian is included along with prostrations.

#### Prayer of St. Ephraim the Syrian

O Lord and Master of my life, take from me the spirit of sloth, meddling, lust of power and idle talk; but give rather the spirit of chastity, humility, patience and love to thy servant; yea, O Lord and King, grant me to see my own sins and not to judge my brother, for blessed art thou unto ages of ages. Amen.

#### Presanctified Liturgy القدسات السّابق تقديسها

(Wednesdays and Fridays during the Great Fast and first three days of Holy week)

The Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts are celebrated on Wednesday evenings and provides an opportunity for the faithful to receive Holy Communion in order to give them strength to continue their fast. Since no Liturgy is allowed to be celebrated during the weekdays of the Great Fast, a second lamb is consecrated on Sunday to be used during the week. Since the lamb is already consecrated and sanctified as the Body and Blood of Christ, the service is called 'Pre-sanctified.' The service entails a combination of vespers and prayers before receiving Holy Communion.

## صلاة النوم الصغرى و صلاة المديح للسيدة Little Compline with the Akathist Hymn to the Theotokos

(The first five Fridays of the Great Fast)

Little Compline is the shorter version of Great Compline that includes evening prayers before one goes to sleep. During the Great Fast, it is the custom of Antiochian and Greek churches to hold Little Compline combined with special salutations/hymns that are sung in adoration of the Theotokos, the Mother of God. These salutations are called in Arabic 'Al-Mediyah – . المدائح During these services, we ask for the intercessions ايتها الفائق قدسها, وof the Virgin Mary to pray for us before the Lord our God and that is why we repeat the refrain, 'Most Holy Theotokos, Save Us! و ألدة الأله خلصينا!

#### Pomegranate molasses is available in the bookstore!

Just like lemon juice, pomegranate molasses is wonderful for enhancing roasted vegetables, salad dressings, and marinades. Here is a salad recipe "fattoush" just in time for lent:

- 1 large head romaine lettuce *chopped*
- 1 large vine-ripe tomato diced
- 2-3 Persian cucumbers *quartered*
- ½ large green pepper chopped
- 5 radishes diced
- 2 green onions sliced
- 1/4 cup Chopped parsley optional

- 3 tablespoon olive oil
- 2 tablespoon lemon juice
- 2 garlic cloves optional pressed or grated
- 1 teaspoon sumac
- 1 teaspoon pomegranate molasses
- ½ teaspoon dried mint
- ½ teaspoon salt & black pepper to taste

#### Fried Pita Bread or (Toast Under broiler)

- 1 large double ply pita bread *cut into triangles*,
- 3 tablespoons olive oil, Salt/pepper to taste

#### INSTRUCTIONS

Make the Dressing: Whisk together the lemon juice, garlic, sumac, pomegranate molasses, dried mint, salt and pepper. Slowly stream in olive oil, whisking continuously until emulsified. Set aside.

Fry the Pita Bread or (Toast under broiler) In a large skillet, heat olive oil on medium heat. Add the pita bread and season with salt and pepper. Cook stirring frequently until the pita bread becomes crispy and golden in color, about 5-7 minutes. Set aside.

Place the lettuce, tomatoes, cucumbers, green peppers, radishes, green onions & parsley in a large serving bowl. Pour the dressing on top and toss to combine.

Add the fried/toasted pita bread to the salad immediately before serving.
